



Partners for Conservation Program (PFC)

This program is administered by Soil and Water Conservation Districts (SWCD) with funds provided by the Illinois Department of Agriculture (IDOA). It provides cost share assistance and other financial incentives for the construction or adoption of projects that address specific resource concerns, such as Soil Erosion, Soil Health, Water Quality, Groundwater Pollution and more.

Contract sign-up is typically done in April, although notification of your interest in the program can be discussed at any time of year. The SWCD Board of Directors prioritize the applications received based on the soil saved vs the project cost of each project submitted. The project providing the most benefit for the least cost will receive the highest consideration.

Eligible practices include terraces, grass waterways, water and sediment control basins, dry dams, cover crops, denitrifying bioreactors, well sealings, and streambank stabilization. For a complete practice list contact our office. The following practices require the completion of all permanent seeding by October 1st: grass waterways, grade stabilization structures, and diversions.

The SWCD Board annually approves a list of average costs provided by the Il. Dept. of Agriculture for the practices listed above. Once a design is completed a cost estimate is provided to the applicant. PFC allows SWCDs to reimburse the applicant 75% of the actual cost, not to exceed the average county cost. The applicant is responsible for performing the required maintenance which is included with the design information that the applicant receives. Most projects require the applicant to maintain the practice for 10 years.

Landowner / Operators Responsibilities

Preplanning Your Projects Will Return Great Benefits for Your Efforts

Projects will not be funded unless written approval is issued by the SWCD prior to work being started.

To apply for Partners for Conservation funds:

- Fill out the application and return to Will-South Cook SWCD.
- Work with Will-South Cook SWCD to obtain a Conservation Plan for your property.
- Work with Will-South Cook SWCD to identify practices and complete a design.
- Complete a STAR application online.
- Sign and return the agreement to Will-South Cook SWCD once it is offered to you.
- No PFC funding will be available for parcels being considered for Solar Facilities.

Constructing the Project:

- Select a contractor. You are strongly encouraged to seek bids from multiple contractors. Please refer to the ESC-1 form provided as it will be used for determining any cost-share payments.
- Use care when mowing or disturbing the area once flagged for construction. **Will-South Cook SWCD will flag the area once. Additional flagging will be done at a rate of \$75.00 per hour.**
- Notify the Will-South Cook SWCD office at least 3 days prior to construction to schedule a preconstruction field meeting that includes yourself, the contractor, and a member of Will-South Cook SWCD to review the design and discuss project expectations.
- Contact J.U.L.I.E. (800) 892-0123 so utilities can be located 48 hours prior to construction. Be prepared to answer questions regarding the location of the practice. Return a copy of the completed J.U.I.E. form, with dig numbers.
- Contractors are expended to notify this office of any cultural artifacts found during construction of this project.
- Will-South Cook SWCD is not responsible for locating field tiles or damaging existing tiles during construction.
- Contact our office if there is a problem found that does not allow the design to be constructed.
- All construction projects requiring a fall permanent seeding must be completed by October 1st.
- Notify the Will-South Cook SWCD office or the SWCD field representative 2 days prior to completion of the practice to schedule a construction check.
- Follow the recommended seeding and fertilizer information provided at the bottom of the Waterway plan.

Once the Project / Practice is Completed:

- Submit paid itemized bills, including construction, seeding & fertilizer bills, to Will-South Cook SWCD for processing and payment.
- Maintain the practice to ensure it is properly functioning for the duration of the written agreement.
