Envirothon is a competitive, problem-solving natural resource event for high school students intended to challenge the students about the environment. The objectives are threefold: (1) to test the environmental knowledge and understanding of high school students regarding natural resource issues: (2) to cultivate within students to consider careers in environmental fields: (3) students learn about team building and enhance their communications skills.

In North America, most K - 12th grade environmental education is delivered outside traditional curriculum and instruction. Programs like the Northeastern Illinois Envirothon, the Illinois Envirothon, and the NCF-Envirothon exemplify current initiatives, providing quality education training and hands-on learning activities in the areas of aquatic ecology, forestry, soils, wildlife, and current environmental issues. With over 500,000 annual participants from across North America, the Envirothon is quickly becoming a primary vehicle for promoting environmental literacy in America's youth.

The Northeastern Illinois Envirothon serves the counties of Boone, Cook, DeKalb, DuPage, Kane, Lake, McHenry, Winnebago, and Will. **This year's competitions will be held March 14, 2023 (South Event - Danada House, Wheaton, IL) and March 16, 2023 (North Event - DeKalb County Farm Bureau).**

An award will be given to the top scoring county winners. Awards for first, second, and third place overall will also be given. The overall highest scoring team will compete during the **Illinois Envirothon – May 3-4, 2023**. The winners of the Illinois Envirothon will represent our state during the **NCF-Envirothon, July 23 through July 29, 2023 at Mount Allison University, Sackville, New Brunswick, Canada (PASSPORTS)**. National Conservation Foundation Envirothon is North America's largest high school environmental education competition featuring teams from across the United States and Canada competing for prizes and college scholarships.

The Event

Teams of five students prepare throughout the winter with study materials provided by the Northeastern Illinois Envirothon Committee in the areas of aquatics, forestry, soils, wildlife, and a current issue, which changes each year. This year's current topic is "Adapting to a Changing Climate". Each team is required to have a sixth team member, considered an alternate; however, the alternate student does not actively participate in the competition process.

At the Envirothon, teams are assigned to one of the five topic areas to begin the competition. Teams move through each topic station in a timed rotation. At each station students will listen to a 20-minute presentation from a professional in the topic's field. Following each presentation students complete a written test and lab practical as a team. Teams will also be required to give an oral presentation addressing an "Adapting to a Changing Climate" scenario. This presentation requirement was developed to better prepare teams for the state and national competition, encourage team problem solving, and advance students' communication skills. While students are attending the competition, advisors will have time to network, share how they prepared for the Envirothon, and attend a teachers' workshop.

If you are registering as an FFA team, oral presentation requirements have been updated. See the registration materials for further details.

Upon registration, a light breakfast snack will be provided. Advisors and teams are expected to stay onsite for the entirety of the event. Lunches will be provided during the event. Currently, we are unable to accommodate all specialty diets, except for a vegetarian option. If a student has a special dietary need or food allergy, they should bring their own lunch. T-Shirts will be provided to the winning Northeastern Illinois Envirothon team, prior to the Illinois Envirothon.

Transportation to and from the Northeastern Illinois Envirothon competition is the responsibility of the participating school / organization. All students must come and leave with their school / organization. If your team advances to the Illinois State Envirothon and NCF-Envirothon, travel is also the responsibility of the participating school / organization. All event registration fees are the responsibility of the participating school, with exception of the Illinois State Envirothon registration fee being paid by Land Use Council 16 for the winning Northeastern Illinois Envirothon team. The Resources

Once the Envirothon Committee has prepared all tests and labs, advisors will receive the study resources via Google Drive for download. Resources are released during the first week of January. The current topic scenario will be released on the Google Drive to all team advisors **by February 14, 2023**, about one month prior to the start of the Northeastern Illinois Envirothon competition. Your team contact will be notified by e-mail, when the materials become available.

The Northeastern Illinois Envirothon committee consists of staff from the Soil & Water Conservation Districts of Northeastern Illinois, collectively called Land Use Council 16. The District's within Land Use Council 16 include: Boone, DeKalb, Kane-DuPage, North Cook, McHenry-Lake, Will-S. Cook, and Winnebago.

The Entry

All teams: registration form and fees are due by **December 2, 2022**. A non-refundable **\$25 registration fee** for entry into the event is required to secure a team's spot in the Northeastern Illinois Envirothon competition. Please make checks payable to **McHenry-Lake SWCD**. ***Note: If you registered your team for the 2020 cancelled competition, you can apply a credit to your registration fee. A list of paid registrations is attached.**

We have set a minimum of 20 teams for the competition to go on as scheduled. If registrations fall below 20, we will cancel the competition.

Advisors/teachers do not need to submit student names at this time. Collection of student names and **ALL talent release forms** must be submitted **before March 3, 2023**.

FFA teams: FFA teams that will **ONLY** participate in the FFA portion of the Illinois Envirothon are required to indicate their affiliation on the registration form. See registration materials for further details.

Registration Guidelines

1. Registrations are due by December 2, 2022 to the McHenry-Lake County SWCD.
2. All registrations must include a \$25 non-refundable registration fee per team. ***Note: If you registered your team for the 2020 cancelled competition, you can apply a credit to your registration fee. A list of cancelled registrations is attached.**

3. Schools / Organizations are permitted to enter up to 2 teams per school /organization. Although you do not need to include names with your initial registration, you must send a separate form & separate \$25 non-refundable registration fee for each team you wish to register. If you are entering two teams, you must indicate "Team 1" or "Team 2" on each form. FFA TEAMS: If you are registering a team affiliated with the National FFA Organization, participating in the FFA Career Development Events program, you must indicate this affiliation on your registration form.
4. A minimum of 20 and a maximum of 40 teams may compete in the NE IL Envirothon competition. Registrations will be accepted on a first come first served basis.
5. The procedure for entering teams into the competition will be as follows:
 - a. Schools' / Organizations' 1st team selections will be entered on a first come first served basis, not to exceed 40 total teams.
 - b. Once all 1st team registrations are entered, 2nd team registrations will be entered also on a first come first served basis, not to exceed 40 total teams.
 - c. Team Advisors will be notified in late December/early January as to which teams have been entered.
6. Team member names and Talent Release forms are due **March 3, 2023**.
7. A study materials link will be sent to the team contact email listed on the registration form in early January.
8. Oral presentation materials will be uploaded to the link **1 month prior** to the competition. Your team contact will be notified by email, when the materials are available.

Rules & Regulations

1. Students enrolled in grades 9 through 12 in the current school year are eligible to compete.
2. Teams must consist of five (5) team members from the same school and/or organization/association and be registered for the competition. One (1) alternate may participate. The addition of an alternate must be noted on the registration form. You may substitute a team member at the beginning of the competition, but this substitution must remain for the entire week of the competition. It is HIGHLY recommended that you register an alternate. **Alternates will not be permitted to participate in testing or in the oral presentation if the original team members are available for competition.**
3. The Envirothon will consist of five subject areas: Aquatics, Forestry, Soils, Wildlife and Current Issue. Students will participate as a five (5) member team.
4. Test questions will cover any information in the resource materials provided to the teams. Notes and materials will **not** be allowed at any time during the competition.
5. Students will work as a five (5) member team to answer test questions. One set of answers will be submitted.
6. The winning team is the team with the highest cumulative point total from the five testing areas and oral presentation. In the event of a tie, the highest score in Aquatics will break the tie. If there is still a tie, Forestry, Soils, and Wildlife areas respectively will decide the winner.
7. The winning team will represent us at the Illinois Envirothon. If the winning team opts not to participate in the state competition or the team consists of less than five (5) team members, the team with the next highest score is eligible. **As per Illinois Envirothon rules, alternates must have attended the current year's local event to compete in the Illinois Envirothon.**
8. The Northeastern Illinois Envirothon Committee will pay the entrance fee to the Illinois Envirothon for our Council winning team. The FFA winning team's entrance fee to the Illinois Envirothon will not be covered.
9. Rules are subject to change and all relevant changes will be explained to the teams and advisors before the competition.
